VOTER SERVICES

• VOTERS GUIDE: Produced and distributed 23,000 copies of Voters Guides for the November election to more than 100 organizations, libraries, colleges, senior residences, religious institutions and other locations.

• VOTE411: Reached 24,184 users with *VOTE411.org*, our online Voters Guide.

• SPANISH LANGUAGE OUTREACH: Collaborated with Hispanic community leaders and provided a Spanish-language presentation toolkit on mail-in ballot voting to share with community groups.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Voter registration/education was the focus from June 1-October 11 and Getting Out the Vote from October 11 through November 8. 247 volunteers disseminated pertinent election and voting information including vote by mail instructions for the midterm election by
